1 SAMUEL

- ▶ 1 Samuel is about two kings, Saul and David. We read about their choices and how they affect their reigns. Saul is proud and terrified of losing power. David is humble, trusting God even through terrifying situations. This book demonstrates that God opposes the proud and exalts the humble.

2 SAMUEL

- ▶ 2 Samuel tells the story of King David's reign. David made some big mistakes and had to suffer the consequences of those mistakes. Despite David's failures, God loves him. In 2 Samuel, we see God's faithfulness and love toward David despite his wrongdoings.

LUKE

- ▶ The book of Luke is a documentation of the story of Jesus. Luke makes a point to show how Jesus fulfilled the Old Testament Scriptures. Through Jesus, God restores his people. Luke was written to strengthen the faith of all Christians and to answer the attacks of non-Christians. The book of Luke urges us to tell everyone about Jesus.

JOEL

- ▶ The book of Joel is a message about the second coming of Jesus Christ. Joel describes a terrible disaster that has fallen on the land and calls the people to repent. He tells us about a future day when God will judge all nations and restore his presence on earth. Joel reminds us that although God's judgment will be fierce, he will show mercy to all who repent and are faithful to him.

RUTH

- ▶ The book of Ruth tells the story of how God used an immigrant woman named Ruth and an Israelite man named Boaz to turn a single family's tragedy into a key part of God's redemption plan. In Ruth, we see how God works through the everyday obedience of ordinary people to accomplish his plan.
